Dear Families

The start of the year is a great time to revisit our emergency procedures. Recently all staff had a refresher course in our Emergency Management plan procedures and today students practised an emergency drill situation so that, if needed in a real situation, they would be familiar with what was asked of them. These practises occur regularly throughout the year with different scenarios each time. They are necessary for children to feel confident that if a real situation occurred they would know that there would be many people there to ensure their safety. We are mindful not to overly alarm the children and stress that these drills are a practise.

With all of the events over summer it is also a good time for families to consider their own emergency arrangements in the event that a situation at home required these. Since the students participated in a drill today you may wish to consider your home emergency plan and discuss this with your children. I understand that:

- DHS will use information I have provided to DET to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DET personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- this consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DHS and provide it to DET so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.

• if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.

• information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

You are able to request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.
