Dear Parents & Guardians,

Starting back at school this week was a big thing for the Preps - Year 2s and their families, especially after such an extended period at home where uniforms weren't worn and if the day didn't start at 9am that was okay, they could catch up throughout the day. Coming back to the routine of school was a big step and for some it was like starting over again. The added challenge of walking in by themselves without parents or other family members made this even more challenging for some. For most the distraction of bubbles, glitter wands and huge animal balloons was enough and they were back in familiar territory again - classmates and teachers with them and back in their own class spaces.

While our juniors have come back to school and core curriculum areas will be covered, our first priority is ensuring that all children have the support they need to transition back. Wellbeing activities, social stories and circle time routines will be more prevalent than usual in their first weeks back. If you have any concerns about how your child may be transitioning back, please contact your child's teacher or Lorraine MacDonald, our Wellbeing Leader so they can support you with this.

As I have said many times throughout this term, these have been challenging times, however the support and willingness to go with us on this Remote Learning journey has been enormous. It wasn't always smooth sailing and we didn't always get it right the first time, but everyone had the mindset that each and every one of us was trying to do their very best in a difficult situation and together we were able to find productive ways forward. Thank you for your support during this time and the accommodations I know you have had to make at home with your own work and schedule to allow Remote Leaning to work.

To limit the number of adults gathering at gates in the afternoon we have had a process of pick up whereby children with surnames A-K are dismissed at 3pm while those with L-Z are dismissed at 3:15 pm. (Siblings with different surnames will go by the eldest sibling surname.) This has been largely successful and will continue for the next few weeks. Drop off in the morning will continue as it was this week also, with children dropped at one of the 4 external gates and no parent/family access. So your child knows which gate to be picked up from we have given them all a key tag today; please write the gate number on this, place it on their bag and we will ensure they are at the correct gate for pick up.

We may need to refine these procedures as more children return to school so we ask for your continued support and patience as we work to keep everyone safe during this time.

#### Returning to School for year 3 - 6

Children in Years 3 - 6 will return to school on Tuesday 9th June.

Any children in these years who were at school for the last 7 weeks can continue to participate in Remote Learning at school until the 9th June. These children will be in their classroom **supervised** by their teacher.

Children whose parents have now returned to work and who have no one to supervise them at home can also return to school early. Please contact me to discuss your situation in this case.

Children considered vulnerable can also return to school prior to the 9th June. Please contact me to discuss your situation in this case.

#### **IMPORTANT DATES**

#### \*Monday 8th June - PUBLIC HOLIDAY

\*Tuesday 9th June - Year 3 - Year 6 return to school

- Any children in Year 3 - Year 6 whose parents choose not to send them back to school will NOT have the opportunity for Remote Learning from the Friday 5th June. This was only ever for the time children could not be at school so once they return teachers will be teaching face to face. Children still at home will now be classed as absent from school.

\*Sanitiser is available in all classrooms and offices so every child/staff member entering a space throughout the day,/returning from the bathroom will need to use this.

\*At this stage children are not able to bring their own sport/play equipment to school. We will have a supply of equipment they can use at break times and we have a process for cleaning this after use.

\*Access to the school for parents and visitors will be limited to essential visits only and all visitors will need to complete safety measures prior to entering. At this stage there will be **NO school canteen** until further notice.

#### Phone Calls

During this time of Remote Learning staff have had many occasions where they have had to contact parents by phone while they have been working from home. In most cases this was with their number blocked and we appreciate parents answering these calls so that we could speak to you and support your child. Sometimes staff have forgotten to hide their number and so parents and carers have access to staff private mobile numbers. If this is the case I ask that you honour the privacy of that staff member and not use this number to contact them.

#### Reports

We hope to get Semester 1 school reports out to parents and carers by the end of this term. However with the staggered return to school we will only have all children back from the 9th June, which is only a few weeks prior to the end of term, so reports <u>may</u> need to be pushed out to the beginning of Term 3. These reports will not be as comprehensive as they have been in the past due to the transition to Remote Learning in Term 2. Our focus will be on giving you a report which comments on your child's achievements in Religious Education, English and Mathematics in Term 1, a summary of the content covered in these 3 areas throughout Term 2 and a comment on your child's mindset and engagement in Remote Learning throughout Term 2. A more detailed explanation of the report and the reasons for these changes will come out with the report.

#### **Uniforms**

My apologies to all parents and carers who tried earlier in the week to email the uniform email account to place their order. There was an issue with this account and it was only working internally and not externally; our technician has since fixed this issue. #### **Drop Off and Pick Up Areas**

ALL Family members dropping off and picking up children are asked to adhere to social distancing requirements. Please see the map with the gates numbered.

Drop Off = Drop off can occur at any one of the 4 numbered gates in the morning; each gate will be supervised by a staff member. Pick Up = Pick Up will be at 3pm A-K and 3:15pm L-Z

- = Parents wait in the park outside gates 3 & 4 and children will come out to you. They will be supervised while waiting by a staff Member
- = Parents can enter Gate 1 (ENTRY ONLY) and walk along the driveway towards Gate 2 (EXIT ONLY). Children will be in family groups and go to parents as they reach the head of the line. All exits here will be through Gate 2
- = Staff will be supervising gate 1 & 2 as well as the children waiting
