Dear Parents & Guardians.

Over recent weeks, those who have been at school have all watched as the work to install the statue of St Catherine of Siena began. After several weeks of work the statue is finally in place and last week, on the 29th July, Bishop Curtain and Fr Michael blessed the statue. The children all watched as Bishop Curtain blessed the statue with incense, Holy Water and prayer. He then spoke to the children and blessed them and their families as well. St Catherine of Siena takes pride of place in the roundabout between the church and the school and she reaches up into branches of the Jacaranda so I can only imagine how beautiful this will all look when it is in full bloom. St Catherine is at the top of a tableau of scenes depicting different milestones and teachings from her life. Over time we will come to learn about all of these and thus enrich our knowledge of St Catherine of Siena.

Tomorrow is the Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, our first Australian Saint. Mary was born in Melbourne, the eldest of 8 children but is best known for her work in South Australia where, with Reverend Tennison Woods, she set up schools and eventually the Sisters of Saint Joseph. She is also known for her many sayings which help us navigate our way through life's challenges - I have put some of these as our reflection this week. Mary MacKillop was canonized on the 17th October 2010.

We have all ridden the roller coaster of numbers of COVID 19 cases over recent weeks and are all waiting for a consistent decline in these which will mean, not only a return to our more usual daily routine, but an increased measure of health for many vulnerable people within our community. While this is a challenging and worrying time, it is something we can all get through if we keep in mind that everyone is doing their very best in unusual circumstances and that it is okay to lean on others when things are hard. Please do not hesitate to call the school or email me if we can be of any assistance to you, especially during this time. We are doing all we can as a school staff to keep ourselves and the children attending school safe. All staff are wearing masks and all classes have an abundant supply of sanitiser and antibacterial wipes. As with any other person in the community, any unwell staff member or child is being asked to remain at home until they are well. If staff are required to have a COVID 19 test they will remain at home until results come back. In some instances staff are still able to work at home; in others they are not. If staff are unable to work at home other teachers in your child's year level will assist with the posting and correcting of work. A huge thank you to everyone in the school community for your support during this time.

Club 50 – 50 records of regular reading


Club 75 – 75 records of regular reading


