

Dear Parents & Guardians,

This term we have again navigated the challenges of remote learning. I am very much aware that this is a juggling act between managing to complete your own work and home tasks, while at the same time having children at home working on school tasks, many of whom require your assistance to do this. However, despite the challenges of this task, we have managed to finish the term with most children completing the majority or all of their tasks on most days - this is a credit not only to the children for their persistence with this but also to the family members who have assisted them.

At this stage, unless things change over the holidays, all children will commence Term 4 with remote learning on Monday the 5th of October. Prep to Year 2 will then return to onsite schooling from Monday 12th October. Years 3 -Year 6 will remain on remote learning until the Premier announces a return to school date for them. Once this date and the procedures around it are confirmed, I will contact parents so that those who may require onsite supervision due to work commitments can complete the necessary forms.

Our priority once children return to onsite schooling will be one of Wellbeing. We are very aware that the children have sorely missed the daily contact with friends and peers and will need support in reconnecting again. While seeing friends online and calling them has been a way of staying connected, it does not fully replace daily face to face contact. Alongside this we will be modifying the curriculum we cover in Term 4 so that the time we do have with the children onsite can be maximised. We will be focussing on Religion, Mathematics and Literacy and the core elements within these 3 areas to assist the children as best we can in consolidating what has been covered during remote learning.

As we head into Spring and the September holidays, may this be a time when you can enjoy each others company and relax without the added dimension of having online school tasks to complete.

Uniform Announcement

Recently a group of parents, representative of different cultural groups, boys and girls and with children in years across the school met to discuss uniform options and a sample set we had received from a new supplier. After discussion with the supplier and considering all parent feedback sent through we have made the decision to change the school uniform as of 2021.

In doing this we have considered the different situations families find themselves in, particularly now, so the following will apply.

- New children to the school will purchase the new uniform
- Children currently enrolled at the school can continue to wear the uniform items they currently have with NO requirement to purchase the new uniform immediately
- As current children require new uniform items they will have access to the new items
- This transition period will be for at least 2021 and possibly longer so families will not be asked to purchase new items immediately.

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
Some tips for home reading from the PETAA website

- Establish a home reading routine. Read aloud with your child each day for about 10 minutes. Talk about the pictures. Show and share your enjoyment for reading.
- The reader holds the book.
- Turn off all devices so that your child has your undivided attention.
- Reading is not a test. Before beginning take a minute or so for an introduction. For example, read and talk about the title, read the blurb, predict what the story will be about, flick through the pages etc.
- Find a reading time that works for your family.
- Choose a comfortable space to read together.
- Ask questions and encourage discussion during the reading and at the end. For example: What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part? Favourite character?
- Encourage your child to read independently. Perhaps a bedtime routine that includes reading before lights are out.
- Try not to interrupt, listen to your child read, support with praise.
- If your child is reading independently, that is, reading chapter books continue to share reading time by talking about books, reading silently together.
- Visit the local library. Let your child choose books based on their interest fiction and nonfiction.
- Model what it means to be an enthusiastic reader by creating an environment where everyone reads and talks about what they have read
