

Gate 4 is half way down the length of the school on the park side



Literacy News

Take Home Books

At St Catherine's reading at home is an integral part of the school's reading program. In order for this to continue this year our students have had to use digital online platforms.

Research shows the importance of reading on a daily basis to develop children's use and understanding of vocabulary. At St Catherine's the expectation is that students read each night as part of their homework. This term, teachers will continue to encourage students to read every night and record in their diary.

So, with great excitement I announce, that for the first time this year our students will have the opportunity to begin borrowing *take home books/readers* from the school's 'Take Home Collection' and, a little later this term, from the school library. The purpose of take home readers is to provide students with books at their level of reading. Students have a 'Take Home Folder' and this should be returned to school each day or as directed by the classroom teacher. Students are asked to take care of the books so that they are not damaged. In addition, they are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that each book borrowed is returned before borrowing any further books. Parents please remind your child/children of the privilege associated with borrowing books and the necessity to return.

Tips for reading take home readers include:

Participating in reading - Your child does not have to always be the reader to participate in reading.

Reading activities could be - Reading with your child, either taking turns or together. Reading to your child. Or, the reading could be done by the child, where the child reads independently, aloud or silently.

Also please note, there is great value in a child reading the same book on a number of occasions - it may be a favourite book or a book the child can read independently.

Book Week


Book Week is fast approaching. We will be celebrating this exciting week during Week 4. A reminder that this year's theme is *Curious Creatures, Wild Minds*.




Book Week 2020

Community News

The following information has been provided by Senior Constable Norman of the Proactive Policing Unit. Regarding safe pick up and drop off times for students and families.

It has come to the attention of local law enforcement with school returning and continuing to return in the coming weeks, many parents and carers are taking serious risks and driving in an unacceptable manner putting themselves and others in danger.

Already this week we have seen numerous near misses involving primary aged children nearly being struck by vehicles as well as a number of collisions. It is imperative that children are dropped off and collected from school in a safe and legal manner.

Some of the things we are seeing include; dropping off and picking up children whilst stationary at a school crossing, parking illegally, performing u-turns in front of oncoming traffic and blocking private driveways. All of this behaviour and more is unacceptable.

We are asking all road users to take greater care in and around school zones. If you are dropping off or collecting children please leave yourself adequate time to find a park and safely attend to your children.

Over the coming weeks Police will be patrolling local areas and will show zero tolerance to anyone offending. Please for the welfare of everyone, take care.

Listed below are some common offences and their penalties which police will be targeting.

Fail to stop and remain stationary at children's crossing	\$413	3 points
Parking offences	\$33 - \$165	-

Seat belt offences	\$330 - \$372	3 points
