Dear Parents and carers.

I hope you and your families enjoyed a wonderful break over the Easter holidays. There are some important changes to COVID-Safe measures for schools that will apply from the start of Term 2.

Face masks

From 11:59 pm Friday 22 April, face masks, while recommended, are not required in any school setting. This means students in year 3 to 6, staff and visitors in primary schools are no longer required to wear face masks. Any student or staff member who wishes to wear a mask may do so, including those who are medically at-risk.

Rapid antigen test screening requirements

Students who have tested positive for COVID-19, and have completed their 7-day isolation period, now do not need to undertake rapid antigen test (RAT) screening for 12 weeks after their release from isolation. This was previously 8 weeks.

Household contacts

Students who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are not required to quarantine. They may return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times during their 7-day period. They are required to notify the school that they are a household contact. Students aged 8 years and above who are household contacts are required to wear face masks when indoors at school unless they have a valid exemption. If a student household contact returns a positive RAT result, they must isolate for 7 days.

Vaccination requirements for visitors to schools

Parents, carers and other adult visitors (not performing work) are no longer required to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine. This includes parents attending a meeting or coming into the office.

Vaccination requirements for visitors working in the schools

Workers at schools include volunteers that attend and who work in close proximity to children, students or staff are required to show proof of vaccination. This includes parent helpers, canteen or tuckshop assistants, reading helpers, excursion supervisors or classroom or working bee volunteers. As such, any volunteer performing any work at a school is as an education worker and they must be fully vaccinated including a booster or have a valid exemption.

RAT screening program reminder

RATs will continue to be supplied for the first 4 weeks of Term 2 to support the early detection of COVID-19 in our school. The testing recommendations will remain the same this Term for students and staff in mainstream schools – recommended to test at home twice a week.

As we approach winter and flu season, the vaccination of children aged 5 to 11 and booster shots for students 16+ remains the best way to ensure protection for students and staff.

If you have any concerns about getting your child vaccinated, please get in contact with your GP or another health professional who can answer your questions.

Thank you for your ongoing support in keeping our school safe.

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Drop Off and Pick Up Term 2 Onwards

As restrictions have eased somewhat there is no longer a need for parents and carers to line up along the front car park or to wait in the park when picking up their children. We will be reverting back to Pre COVID arrangements so please note the following -

Morning Routine

Parents and carers can come into the yard at the beginning of the day to drop their children off. The children have developed their independence in doing this for themselves so allowing them to carry their bag and come in by themselves sometimes is an important skill to foster. GATES 1, 2 & 4 WILL ALL BE OPEN IN THE MORNING. Gate 4 will not be staffed. A staff member will be on duty at the entrance gate and church gate as well as 2 staff members in the yard from 8:30 am onwards.

Parents and carers who need to see office staff can come in without needing to wear a mask or show vaccination status. We do ask though that you not visit the school if you are unwell.

Afternoon Routine

Parents and carers can come into the Prep asphalt yard at the end of the day to pick children up. GATES 1, 2, 3 & 4 WILL ALL BE OPEN FOR ENTRY AND EXIT.

Parents can also make appointments to see staff at these times. If entering the school for a meeting you do not need to wear a mask but may do so if you wish.

If a parent or carer is a household contact of a positive case they can still attend the school to drop off and pick up other children or to attend a meeting. If household contacts enter the building they will need to wear a mask indoors unless they have a valid exemption.

Other Miscellaneous Items

We will be running parent helper training sessions for any parents and carers who wish to help in classes. All parent helpers MUST have a current Working With Children's Check and be fully vaccinated to work in the school.

> Excursions will be occurring at various stages throughout the year. If you wish to assist please make sure you have a current Working With Children's Check and are fully vaccinated.


Gate 1 is under the electronic sign and directly in front of the new administration building








Parent Helper Program




