

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week we had a child who was not picked up at the end of the day and we were unable to contact either parent and the residential address was not correct. It is important that we have your current phone numbers, address and emergency contacts and that you are able to answer the phone when we call. You can imagine the anxiety of this child as they waited an extremely long time to be picked up by their family.

There are a number of children who wait at the lake in the park to be picked up. These children are essentially unsupervised while they are waiting, and some are waiting for a long time. Children around water unsupervised is a dangerous combination, so any children waiting in this area without a parent present will be brought back to the school gates where they can be supervised by staff on duty until they are picked up. Children not picked up by 3:30pm when duty finishes will be taken into the school office where they can be collected. In this way we can all be confident that all children are safe and supervised while waiting to be picked up. I ask that all parents who have asked their children to wait in this area instruct their children to wait at the school pick up points where they can be supervised, thank you in advance for your co-operation in this.

We are currently accepting enrolments for 2023. To be eligible for Prep in 2023 children need to turn 5 before the end of April 2023. If any families have children currently at kinder who will be attending school in 2023 please pick up an enrolment pack from the office and return this with your child's birth certificate, immunisation certificate and Baptism certificate as soon as possible. Interviews for 2023 enrolments will begin on Tuesday, 31st May. Your child is expected to attend these interviews with you.
