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

Dear parents and carers,

It is hard to believe that we are coming to the end of another year and that after thirteen years my final days at St Catherine's are approaching. When I started here all those years ago I was welcomed into the community with open arms and warm smiles and that has not changed from that day to this. We have certainly celebrated many highs, shared the fun times, managed to find a way through the difficult times and comforted each other in the sadness that life sometime brings.

Fr Michael was always only a call away and constant in his support and counsel - even when he was chaplain on a cruise ship in the middle of the Pacific he answered calls and provided support. I thank him for his trust in me all those years ago when he offered me this position and for his support ever since.

To the amazing children I have had the pleasure of knowing – you have given back to me more than you can know. I became a teacher to work with children to help them discover all that they could be and the strengths and talents they have. To all of the families who have travelled these thirteen years with me. Thank you for entrusting your children to us and me. You have always been there to support us. I remember one time a number of parents came in to volunteer to mind children so the staff could attend a staff member's funeral – a very real example of a community giving unconditional support and care. I said to one of the parents that if I was going to another school I would want a community just like this one as it's pretty terrific. Sincere thanks to you all for your messages and well wishes, your fundraising, presence at numerous school events, participation in working bees in those early days, help on excursions and so much more. I always say that education is a two-way relationship between home and school and you have always upheld your part in that relationship.

There have been numerous staff over these thirteen years and while we will have our private goodbyes I wish to thank you all publicly for your care and dedication to the children we have the privilege of working with each day. You are an amazing group of people who know how to have high expectations for the children and their learning but also put the fun into each day for them and each other as well. It has been a pleasure to work with each one of you on your own personal and professional journey and thank you for what you have contributed to mine.

This was indeed the right community for me to be principal and I will always cherish my time here; it is the longest I have stayed at any school I have worked and this community will always hold a very special place in my heart. While I know that it is time for me to go and a new principal to come in with fresh eyes; it will still be hard to hand in my keys and walk away. One of the children asked me if I was going to another school and if I was why couldn't I stay here. My answer – no I'm not going to another school, this is the best one I've worked at so I couldn't start somewhere else – a satisfactory answer for them but also so very true.
