GROWING UP HEALTHY IN A WORLD OF DIGITAL MEDIA

Dear Parents, Carers, & Students,

Two weeks ago, the school invited families to participate in the Inform and Empower Information Evening that focused on raising children in a digital world.

The timing of this was uncanny given that within a week of this, the school learnt of a TikTok site that had been created by students using the school's logo and posting derogatory and inappropriate content. In speaking further with students, we had also learnt of the inappropriate use of social media by several students who were making inappropriate comments about other students online.

We as a school, can only control what happens within the school, while our students are at school. When it comes to the use of social media by our students, this matter is very much a parental responsibility. We, as a school community, rely on each and every parent to actively supervise their child's use of this when not in school.

Our children are exposed to technology from an early age, making parental oversight crucial. When canvasing our Year 6 students earlier this week as to how many had a social media account, it was concerning as to the number of students who had raised their hand in comparison to the number that indicated their family's participation in the Inform & Empower evening.

The internet, while beneficial for learning and communication, poses risks like cyberbullying, inappropriate content and excessive screen time.

Parents play a vital role in ensuring their children navigate the digital world safely and responsibly.

Active supervision helps protect your child/ren from online dangers. By monitoring their online activities, parents can prevent exposure to harmful content and teach them about privacy and security. It can also make a parent aware if their child is the child who is causing emotional and psychological harm to others through the use of social media.

Open communication about responsible internet use fosters trust and encourages children to seek guidance when faced with online challenges.

Ultimately, parental oversight is not about restricting freedom but guiding children to make informed choices. By staying involved, parents equip their children with the skills to use technology wisely, ensuring a safer and more positive digital experience.

This weekend's Gospel reading is the holy Gospel according to Luke 9:11-17

They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.



Gospel Reflection

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the central celebration of Christianity – the Eucharist. All three readings relate to this Eucharistic theme. In the second reading, we have the first written account of the Last Supper and what came

to be seen as Jesus instigating the Eucharist. Paul's account, written well before the gospels, was entrenched in the tradition by the time the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke echoed these words of Jesus at the Last Supper. Of course, it is these same words that are spoken by the priest at the consecration in the Eucharistic Prayer each Mass. The words used today are the very same words that have been used in the Church for two millennia. Rather than a gospel account of the Last Supper to celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are presented with what is widely regarded as another 'eucharistic' story from the gospel of Luke. The feeding of the five thousand with five loaves and two fish is regarded as a eucharistic story because it was a clear example of God's presence in a miraculous meal. All of the meal stories in the gospel of Luke are instructive for the audience. Whenever the gospel writer refers to a meal, the meal is used to teach about the reign of God. The gospel writer uses meals to demonstrate who is welcome in the reign of God. Like in today's gospel, the author of Luke's gospel was keen to show that the reign of God is available to anyone who wishes to be a part of it. The reign of God is inclusive and welcoming; no one will be turned away.

Historical context - Table fellowship

In 1st Century Palestine, who you shared a meal with was a very political act. Your status in society was judged by who you kept company with and particularly with whom you shared food. At times, Jesus broke these rules and practised open table fellowship – sharing meals with people of all stations in life and often being criticised for his actions by the Scribes and Pharisees. Part of Jesus' open table fellowship meant that he also ate with dignitaries and religious leaders, but he used these occasions to remind them of the inclusive message of God that they were ignoring.

Gospel focus – Give them something yourselves

In the gospel, the disciples encourage Jesus to send the crowds away to find food for themselves. Jesus tells the disciples, "Give them something to eat yourselves." This is a challenge and a test of the disciples – a chance for them to be like Jesus. He calls them to act with compassion and do what he would do to feed the people. But the disciples fail to grasp either his meaning or the opportunity and the miracle is left to Jesus. Jesus believed that they could feed the people if they tried but the disciples didn't have that same faith in themselves.

Have you thought - Twelve baskets?

The gospel passage tells us that after the five thousand people had eaten as much as they wanted, the remaining scraps filled twelve baskets. What is significant about twelve baskets of leftovers? Twelve was an important number – it represented the twelve tribes of Israel. Whenever the gospels mention twelve things they are symbolically talking about the nation of Israel. In this case, the message is that no matter how many people feast on the message of Jesus and accept the reign of God, there will still be enough to 'feed' the twelve tribes of Israel. No one need be left out!

Year 5/6 Police incursion



On Thursday 12th of June, the Year 5 and 6 students participated in a valuable incursion with members of Victoria Police, focusing on the important topics of bullying and cyber safety.

The session helped students understand the impact of bullying- both in-person and online and the role they each play in creating a respectful, safe school community. The two officers spoke about how to identify different types of bullying, how to respond safely and the importance of speaking up and supporting others.

The cyber safety component reminded students about the risks and responsibilities of being online. They learned practical tips for protecting their personal information, being respectful digital citizens and what to do if they experience or witness unsafe online behaviour.

Our students were engaged, respectful and asked thoughtful questions throughout. This session has given them greater awareness and confidence to make safe, responsible choices both at school and online.
