


Dear Parents, Carers, & Students,

This coming weekend, we celebrate the Feast of St Peter & Paul. Throughout most of the Church's history, these two major figures of Peter and Paul, have been linked, and so it is fitting that they share a common feast day. However, Peter has been given greater regard and has held a more significant place in the tradition. In fact, the Church itself is often described as 'Petrine' – in the tradition of Peter. Much is made of the line of Popes being traced back to Peter. The authority and structure of the Church is linked to the Petrine model of Church. Describing Peter as the 'rock' upon which the Church was built is an excellent image of stability and constancy.





In something of a contrast, the apostle Paul is best known as the great traveller who spread the message of Jesus all around the shores of the Mediterranean, establishing communities of faith wherever he went. His letters – or epistles - to these communities were some of the first Christian writings; predating by 20 years or more the four gospels of the New Testament. Rather than stability and constancy, Paul is identified with growth and change; expansion and openness. I would argue that without Paul the early Christian communities may not have survived beyond the end of the 1st Century.

Normally I would only publish the weekend's Gospel, however to honour these two great Saints I have included both the Second Reading and Gospel Acclamation. I encourage you to take a moment and read it. For myself, having travelled late last year to Greece and followed the path that St Paul took as he proclaimed and lived out Christ's message to us all, I cannot help reflect upon how profound the teachings of Christ were then and continue to be now in our own community.

May you be blessed to be able to change and grow and in doing so, become a pillar of hope and inspiration for others.

How Parents Can Get the Most Out of Parent-Teacher Meetings

Parent-teacher meetings are valuable opportunities to discuss a child's progress, strengths and areas for improvement. To make the most of these conversations, parents should:

- Prepare in Advance Review the child's recent work, grades and behaviour beforehand. Note any concerns or questions to discuss.
- 2. Be Open and Positive Approach the meeting with a collaborative mindset, listening to the teacher's insights while sharing observations from home.
- 3. Ask Specific Questions Instead of general inquiries like "How is my child doing?", ask targeted questions about academic performance, social skills and engagement in class.
- 4. Discuss Strategies for Improvement If challenges arise, work with the teacher to develop actionable steps for support at school and home.
- 5. Follow Up After the meeting, reinforce key points with the child and maintain communication with the teacher if needed.

By being proactive, engaged and solution-focused, parents can ensure productive discussions that benefit their child's learning journey.



At St Catherine's we have a dedicated room for therapy sessions and encourage classroom observation by allied health professionals. Both parents and therapists are required to complete a number of legal documents before starting and booking has previously been made through the office and Learning Diversity Leader. This can be time consuming and cause delay for the therapists and families. We are very happy to announce we now engage with an online booking system School Therapy.

We love School Therapy because it replaces a time-consuming and detailed process with an efficient and consistent online service. Therapists love School Therapy too. Engagement approval can happen in less than an hour, session bookings in minutes, and the visitor portal shows them exactly what they need to do so they don't get tripped up by missing paperwork.

Grade 5-6 Students



This Weekends Scripture & Reflection

Second Reading

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18

All that remains now is the crown of righteousness. My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!

You are Peter, the rock on which I will build my Church;

the gates of hell will not hold out against it. Alleluia!

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 16:13-19

You are Peter, and I will give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?'

Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed

this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.'

Gospel Reflection

Peter and Paul symbolise two facets of our Christian community: mission and maintenance. Paul was the great missionary and Peter was the great leader who held together the earliest disciples. Both were crucial to the Christian community's expansion and survival.

The image of the missionary venturing out boldly to proclaim Christ to the world is so much more engaging than being a maintainer. But every organisation or institution needs someone to provide a clear focus and vision, and to establish structures that will see the group survive past the first generation. To this day we need our Peters and our Pauls.

Peter and Paul did not always have an easy relationship. We know from the Acts of the Apostles that they disagreed about a fundamental issue in the earliest Christian mission: for whom was the good news of Jesus intended? Peter thought it was just for Jews. Paul argued it was for the Gentiles as well. What makes Peter's leadership so outstanding is that he not only listened carefully to what Paul said, but saw what Christ was doing among the Gentiles. He trusted that the working of the Spirit was bigger than he was, and that it included a man who never met Jesus and yet seemed to have a richer insight into where and how Christ was to be preached. That takes courage and humility.

Today we need to be careful that in Christ's name we do not bind things up so tightly that we leave no room for the Holy Spirit to challenge or surprise us. Having the courage and humility to 'hang a bit loose' is not weakness. It can be about trusting that Christ's saving love is still at work in unexpected ways with all people everywhere.

Peter and Paul show what can happen when we cooperate with Christ in living out his love. Things we never dreamt of become possible. But their lives also show us the cost. Both of them died as martyrs. We may not be asked to embrace martyrdom in our lives, but in the way we run our race we are challenged to keep the faith and proclaim Christ by how we live. By doing so we are assured that when we come to heaven we will be greeted by Peter and Paul and with them we will behold the fullness of love, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, for eternity.
