# 2025 Class Placement Parental Input

Your child's current teachers have spent an amazing amount of time with your child during the school year. They are aware of most, but maybe not all, of your child's strengths and challenges from a school perspective. It is their knowledge, observation and insight that provide the basis from which class structures and placement are created.

However, as a parent, your knowledge is far more profound through the simple relationship of child and parent. You hear the story of their daily experiences and know intimately of your child's strengths, challenges and amazing potential. You know of the relationships they have in and outside of school, the learning and teachers that inspire them to do their best and the friendships that either help them to flourish or, at times, struggle.

It is within this context that we invite you to write about your child's learning and social needs to assist us in the placement of your child into specific classrooms for the 2026 school year.

When receiving a letter that requests a specific

teacher, knowing that the teacher may not be in the same year level the following year, we read it as a parent's way of expressing the type of teacher your child responds well to. In doing so, it affirms the quality, temperament, characteristics of the teaching staff that we wish to foster at St Catherine of Siena.

At the same time, it gives us an insight into the quality of relationship that has been formed between parent and teacher over the year(s). A positive relationship between parent, student and teacher makes a huge difference in the way a student engages in their learning and the school community.

Please note that we may not be able to provide you with exactly what you want, but we do try to do our best given the many and diverse factors that go into making up a class.

- Individual differences
- Gender balance
- Relationships with other students
- Age
- Social and emotional maturity
- Academic achievement
- Family groupings
- Length of time a class or group has been together
- Class placements in previous years
- Student teacher relationships

# Positive Behaviour for Learning

For the last two weeks of the school term our students will be unpacking the PBL expected behaviour of <u>I enter and leave learning areas quietly and calmly.</u> This expected behaviour links to the Value of Respectful and specifically though transition times in all areas of our school.

When the teachers explicitly teach a PBL lesson, they have to list a rationale i.e. Why teaching this expected behaviour is important at our school? To be Respectfully at St Catherines we look after myself and others in all I do and say including moving around our classrooms and the school quietly and calmly as this helps to keep us safe.

When a students is demonstrating the expected behaviours we might see them;

- > enter and leave classroom area quietly
- walk quietly and calmly in all indoor spaces
- wait my turn when walking through doorways
- > follow the Transition in a Line Routine
- > follow the After Play Line Up Routine
- move carefully in the yard to different locations (eg specialist transition times, lining up in the yard)

After this has been explicitly taught the students coconstruct a list of examples and non-examples of the expected behaviour:


### **Footy Colours Day Prizes**

#### This week's Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can.

#### Gospel Reflection:

During this time of footy finals, we see hundreds of dedicated followers travelling distances to see their team play, hopefully to win a place in the finals. This seems to me a costly experience, but apparently worth it for the reward of cheering on your team towards a win.

Jesus tells his disciples that following him will be a costly experience, not in monetary terms, but in "taking up the cross". Jesus is not talking about a wooden cross, like the one he carried, but the crosses of everyday life, of living and working with others as a Christian. The invitation to "take up your cross" is not a good selling point one would think, but the point is, Jesus does not want half-hearted followers, wishy-washy Christians.

How would you rate yourself as a follower of Jesus from 1-10? Think about it.
