This information allows staff to monitor your child appropriately, make any necessary adjustments to their learning or play and keep our records and **Student Health Support Plans** up to date.


Even if the matter seems minor, your communication helps us to work together to keep every child safe, supported and ready to learn.

Coming in 2026: Our Transition from Operoo to Compass

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving communication and efficiency, we'll be transitioning from Operoo to Compass as our school communication platform from the start of the 2026 school year.

Operoo recently announced that it will cease operations in Australia from 2026. While this marks the end of a familiar system, it also provides an exciting opportunity for us to move to a more comprehensive and integrated platform.

Compass is a widely used school management system designed to streamline communication, administration and learning through a single app. It will allow families to manage all school-related information in one place — from student attendance and learning progress to excursion permissions, academic reports and booking learning conversations.

The move to Compass will allow us to:

- Simplify communication between school and home
- Reduce the number of apps and systems families need to access
- Make key information about your child's schooling easier to find and manage
- Provide a consistent experience for parents, students and staff

We understand that any change takes time and we'll support families with clear information and guidance before we go live next year. Further details about how to set up your Compass account and make the most of its features will be shared later in 2025.

We're confident that Compass will make it easier for everyone to stay connected and informed, helping us continue to build a strong and efficient school community.

Visit from Auslan Education Services

On October 31, we were delighted to welcome three representatives from Auslan Education Services (AES) — Naiomie (a presenter featured in the AES learning videos), Mel (an AES team member), and Eve (an interpreter). Their visit provided our students with a valuable opportunity to learn more about the experiences of the Deaf community.



Mel began the session with a Q&A, asking Naiomie about the advantages and challenges of being Deaf, whether anyone in her family is also Deaf, and how Deaf people use technology such as vibrating alarm clocks and flashing smoke alarms. After this engaging discussion, students had the chance to introduce themselves to Naiomie using Auslan.

Next, Naiomie led a group activity to practise the Auslan alphabet. The highlight came when she demonstrated her incredible signing speed — completing the entire alphabet in just **2.7 seconds!** Although Naiomie was the clear winner of the alphabet race, every student received a sticker for their participation, marking a fun and memorable end to the session.
