Over the weekend of 10–12 July 2026, the National Karate Championships were held in Hobart, Tasmania.

ACTION REQUIRED: Breakfast Club Updated Permissions

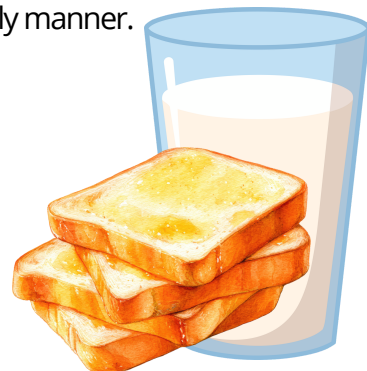
To help streamline our Breakfast Club program and ensure students can access breakfast club efficiently, we are updating our permission process from Term 3.

Year 4 Camp Information Night

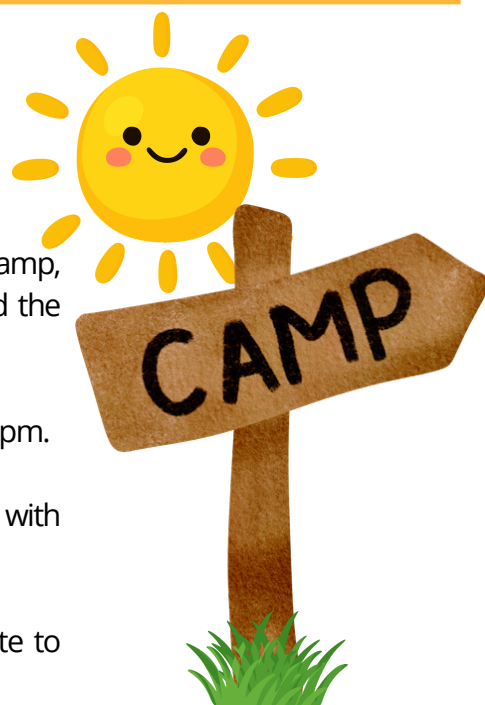
The Year 4 Camp Information Evening will be held on Tuesday, 21 July 2026.
